# **Building Transformation**

#### Inspiring tomorrow's firefighters, paramedics, food producers, and dental

Southwestern is pleased to deliver year after year on our 64-year commitment to provide our students with exceptional teaching and learning environments.

Come fall term, we will celebrate completion of a \$5.5 million project to modernize 18,240 sq. ft. of space in historic Coaledo Hall and nearby Sumner Hall on the Coos Campus. This project culminates five years and \$43 million of infrastructure investment to update buildings, energy systems and teaching space on both the Coos and Curry Campuses.

Built in 1965, Coaledo Hall served as the College's science lab building until it was taken out of service in 2021 with the opening of advanced laboratories in Umpqua Hall. Today, Coaledo will become a new flexible learning space with technology-rich labs for Forestry and Agroecology.

The development closes the loop on creating a holistic center for Forestry and Agroecology students. They now can move with peers between collaborating in the classroom environment to working in the campus' urbai forest/wetland environment and food production gardens.

A renovated Sumner Hall nearby, the site of former nursing labs, remains dedicated to training tomorrow's allied as the home for a re-envisioned Dental Assisting program and an ambulance simulation lab and classrooms to s Fire Science, EMS and Paramedicine.

Overall, this work helps the College hire and retain highly skilled faculty. It ensures residents from the south coa college education and high-skill job training equivalent to that offered in metro areas. Ultimately, the result is a economically healthier communities and families.

This current project was funded with a \$2.75 million capital grant from the Oregon Legislature matched with \$2 U.S. Economic Development Administration.

Upon successful completion of this upgrade class the mariner will have the knowledge of navigation, seamanship, and federal regulations necessary to accept the responsibility for the safety of vessels less than 200 GRT on near coastal routes, including its cargo and passengers; be aware of the obligations under federal regulations concerning safety and protection of the marine environment; and be able to take the practical measures necessary to meet those obligations. 

Crystal contacted the SBDC in Coos Bay and met with Mary Loiselle, a Business Advisor. Mary explained all the resources that available to them, including LivePlan, an online business plan software program. Mary walked Crystal through all the steps to writing their business plan. Over the next several months, Crystal and Mary met regularly to complete the business plan. Throughout the process, Mary introduced Crystal to different lenders they could work with. Funding options can become overwhelming and Crystal learned that sometimes one lender would not be able to help but another one would.

Crystal's advice to others as they go through this process is, "Don't get discouraged. Just keep working on your business plan and work with your advisor."

As Crystal worked through the business plan, she was able to forecast three years into the future how the business would potentially operate. It was insightful to see areas that needed to improve and how small changes could make a huge difference in the month-to-month operation of a business. years, I have been the face of the company. 
