





Что касается умственного развития, младенцы быстро приобретают новые когнитивные навыки/способности. Они проходят важные этапы, такие как развитие постоянства объекта, понимание причинно-следственных связей и начало общения с помощью жестов и лепетания. Образовательная среда играет решающую роль в стимулировании и поддержке этого умственного развития с помощью подходящих по возрасту игрушек, интерактивных занятий, отзывчивого взаимодействия со значимыми взрослыми. In terms of mental development, infants rapidly acquire new cognitive skills/abilities. They go through important milestones such as developing object permanence, understanding cause-and-effect relationships, and beginning to communicate through gestures and babbling. The educational environment plays a crucial role in stimulating and supporting these mental developments through age-appropriate toys, interactive activities, and responsive interactions with significant adults.

Did you know....

Using visuals in your classroom can help reduce anxiety and supports emotional regulation?

Posting and using visual schedules and expectations helps children have security in knowing what is coming next in the daily routine. This also helps adults be consistent which is an important trauma responsive and inclusive practice. Everyone feels safer and less anxious when they know what to expect and what is happening to and around them.


Visuals use words and/or pictures to communicate expectations. Some children might benefit from having access to individual sets of visuals showing the daily schedule, behavior expectations, and emotional regulation tools. A bonus of using visuals is that they promote literacy development and support multilingual classrooms as well!

Spark, Oregon's Quality Recognition and Improvement System for early childhood care and education programs, is being redesigned! 
UPDATE YOUR INFORMATION

The Spark Program Update Report (SPUR) is used to update information and/or request an extension or a reinstatement of a star rating. It will also collect information about continuous quality improvement efforts, and your commitment to maintain quality standards. Completing this report annually is required for programs to remain eligible for future opportunities through Spark, such as additional funding.

Childhood Education & Family Studies Program

ECE 102 01 & 102B 01 Theory and Practicum II Pre-K - (5 Credit) Online

Prerequisites: ECE 209 & 209B; Central Background Registry (CBR) check is required for this course. The third in a sequence of courses with a practicum co-requisite designed to assist students gaining experience working with young children in a laboratory or qualified preschool setting.

- ECE 150 01 Introduction and Observation (4 Credit) Online
- 20 OA A beginning course focusing on the theoretical foundations, history and basic concepts of early childhood education.
 - ECE 170 01 Health and Safety Early Childhood (3 credit) Online
- This course covers health/safety practices recommended for the early childhood field and includes information on common diseases, health, and nutrition. Completion of First Aid & CPR for Infants and Children, and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect Certification are required to pass this course.
- ECE 240 01 Lesson and Curriculum Planning (3 Credit) Online
 Students will be introduced to various approaches to planning early childhood curriculum to meet the whole child's development. The course will review existing curriculum models, and students will develop theme based curriculum, units, lesson plans, and assessments in math, science, and social studies for young children.
- ED 135 01 Teaching Math to Young Children (3 Credit) Online
 Young children live in a world full of mathematics! This curriculum course focuses on the pre-math concepts and early math concepts important for young children (pre-kindergarten through second grade) to grasp so they can be successful in math throughout their lives.
 - ED 169 01 Overview of Student Special Needs (3 Credit) Online
- An introductory course covering categories of special needs and medical conditions that educators must be able to recognize and understand in order to plan, serve, and teach students effectively. Focuses on inclusion strategies and activities that enable educators to successfully provide an optimal educational environment for all students, including those with diverse abilities.
 - ED 216 01 Introduction to Education (3 Credit) Online
- 30 PPLD This course introduces students to the historical, philosophical, and contemporary foundations of the American educational system.
 - HDFS 225 01 Prenatal Infant and Toddler (3 Credit) Online
- This course covers principles of theory and development beginning with conception through three years of age.

 HGD Emphasis is placed on physical, intellectual, emotional, and social development of the young child, including a strong focus on early brain development.
